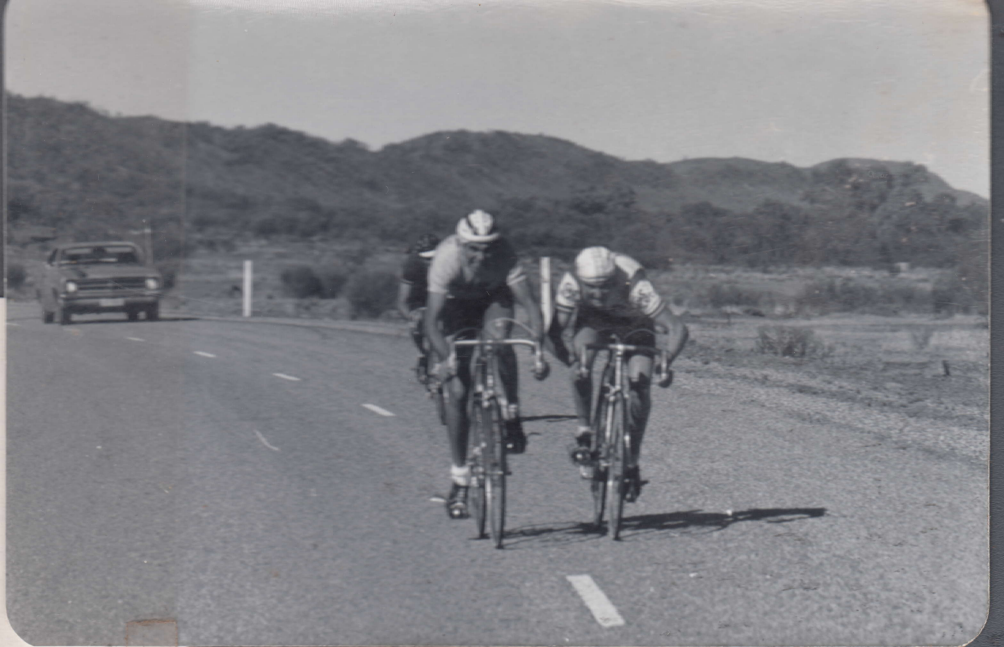

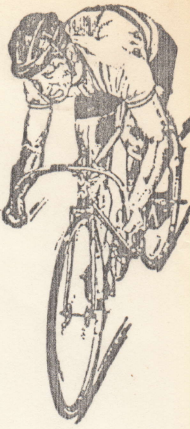

Alice Springs Amateur Cycling Club Inc.



The Alice Springs Amateur Cycling Club Inc. is a friendly and progressive club which conducts events of one sort or another ten months of the year.

During the winter, road racing over distances of up to 270km take riders, officials and supporters up or down the track or west as far as Glen Helen. In contrast, in the warmer summer months, short road races on circular courses and track events are normally held in town.

In addition to the racing program, there are cyclethons, barbecues, theatre nights, touring events, roller competitions, novelty events and more.

Fund raising for organisations like the Lions Heart Foundation, as well as the Club's Velodrome building fund, and fares to send selected riders to interstate competitions, keep the A. S.A.C.C.'s members very busy the whole year round.

The A.S.A.C.C. is affiliated with the newly formed Northern Territory Amateur Cycling Association, which in turn is a member of the Australian Amateur Cycling Federation.

The largest current project the Alice Springs Amateur Cycling Club has in hand is the construction of an International Standard Velodrome and Club rooms on a 3.2 hectare site belonging to the Club bordered by Cameron Street, and Sargent Street.

Estimated to cost about \$500,000, the project is ambitious and far sighted for a small club. However, the benefits to the Community as a whole in future years far out weighs the degree of difficulty involved.

The complex, when finished, will form the nucleus of cycling in the Northern Territory. Add to this the natural cycling country surrounding the Alice, and in the Glen Helen region, and it's not hard to be enthusiastic about the future of cycling here.

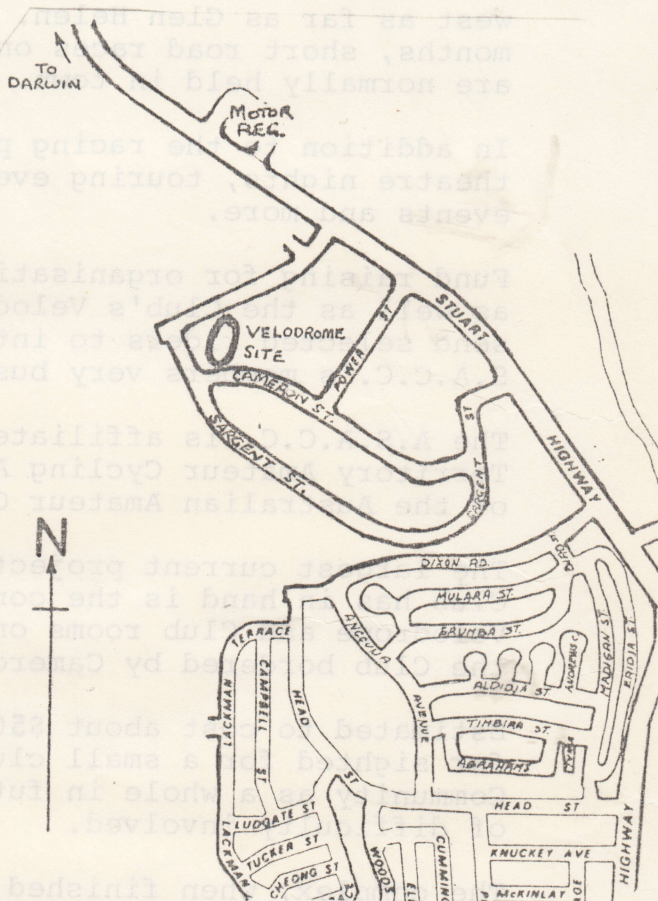

GLEN HELEN TOUR

A brief History of the Glen Helen Tour. In 1980 the members of the Alice Springs Amateur Cycling Club conceived the idea of conducting a road race from Alice Springs to Glen Helen and back.

In August 1981 following talks with the management of Glen Helen Lodge, a 4 Stage road race was run over the Saturday and Monday of the N.T.'s Picnic Day weekend. With the Sunday being taken up with the Northern Territory Amateur Cycling Association's 1981 Road Cycling Championships, held at Glen Helen. The race was named The Glen Helen Tour and the distance approximately 270 Km. Competitors came from Alice Springs and Darwin cycling clubs. There were 20 nominations and 7 finished the event, Geoff Scott of Darwin was 1st, Paul Cook of Alice Springs 2nd and Patrick Brennan of Darwin 3rd. There were three sponsors and the value of prizes totalled approximately \$500.

Following the limited success of the first tour the organisers planned a more elaborate affair for 1982. With more sponsors the value of the race to the riders was more than \$2000.

Several new elements were introduced, the valuable interest of the Northern Territory Government Tourist Bureau enabled a new innovation, the Teams Time Trail, to be run in a unique setting on an exciting course from Glen Helen Gorge to Ormiston Gorge and return. Use was made of the other Scenic spots along the tour route. Stages one and two involve Simpsons Gap while Stages 5 and 6 incorporated a stop at Standley Chasm (Angkala).

Nominations were received from South Australia, Queensland and Victoria as well as the Territory and the numbers involved were swelled by the inclusion of events for Sub-Juvenile and Juvenile Riders on each of the Two Racing Days.

The N.T. Road Championships had occupied the Saturday of the Picnic Day weekend and the Tour was run on Sunday and Monday. Special help in running these events on a tight schedule was provided by the Alice Springs Amateur Radio Club who helped officials control the racing and relayed information to Radio 8HA for broadcast, and The Lions Club of Alice Springs who provided extra Marshals. Seventeen riders contested the finishing sprint on Larapinta Drive in front of a good crowd alerted by the hourly radio reports of the races progress. ABC T.V. News and other media were present to see N.T. Champion Shayne Bannan win the sprint from National Road Champion John Watters from South Australia. Watters won the Tour by an impressive margin with Gary Phillips (SA) second and Shayne Bannan (N.T.) third. Time for the 316 Km was 7 hours, 23 minutes, 45 seconds. The Team Time Trial was won by the South Australians as was the overall Tour Team Prize.

1982 GLEN HELEN TOUR — STAGE 1

THE TOUR COMMENCED ON SUNDAY MORNING 1ST AUGUST AT THE DIARAMA VILLIAGE WITH A 20 KM INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL TO SIMPSONS' GAP.

STARTING INSTRUCTIONS AND NUMBERS WERE ISSUED AT 8:30AM AND TIME KEEPERS CHECK WATCHES READY TO START THE EVENT AT 9:AM.

AT 10 SECONDS BEFORE 9AM THE COUNTDOWN WAS STARTED AND PRECISELY AT 9AM CST. VICKY LAWSON FROM EASTERN DISTRICTS CLUB IN SOUTH AUST. WAS ON HER UNPACED RIDE TO SIMPSONS' GAP. THE 1982 GLEN HELEN TOUR HAD BEGUN.

SEVENTEEN RIDERS IN GROUP ONE ARRIVED AT ^{THE FINISH AT} SIMPSONS GAP ONE BY ONE AND THE TIMES GOT FASTER AND FASTER FROM THE 34 AND 33 MINUTE RUNNERS TO 4 RIDERS ON 32 THEN TWO MORE ON 31 ^{ONE ON 30} THEN ON TO 3 RIDERS ON 29 MINUTES. OF THESE, JOHN WHITEEY AND DARRYL FLORANCE FROM ALICE SPRINGS WERE IN GOOD COMPANY WITH RICK SMITH FROM ADELAIDE.

THEN CAME ALBERT STEFFAN FROM MT. ISA QLD. AND GARY PHILLIPS FROM PORT ADELAIDE SA. ONLY 5 SEC BETWEEN THEM IN THE 27 MINUTE BRACKET. THESE TWO RIDERS AVERAGED 43 KM/HR. WHAT COULD BE EXPECTED FROM N.T. CHAMPION SHANE BANNAN OF DARWIN AND AUSTRALIAN ROAD CHAMPION JOHN WATTERS FROM ADELAIDE?

BANNAN'S SMOOTH STYLE IDENTIFIED HIM AS HE APPROACHED THE LINE. THEN HE WAS HOME, HE CLOCKED 26 MIN 37 SEC.

A ROAR FROM THE CROWD AND THE OFFICIAL CRY 'RIDER COMING' GREETED WATTERS THE CHAMPION AS HE RUSHED TO THE

CHECKERED FLAG. HIS TIME WAS A VERY FAST 25 MIN 38 SEC.
HE HAD AVERAGED 46.8 KM/HR FOR THE 20 KM JOURNEY
ESTABLISHED A LEAD OF OVER 1 MINUTE OVER HIS NEAREST
RIVAL AND WON THE RIGHT TO WEAR THE YELLOW
LEADERS JERSEY IN STAGE 2.

1982 GLEN HELEN TOUR — STAGE 2

AFTER GIVING THEIR ALL IN THE TIME TRIAL, THIS 99 Km STAGE TO THE SECOND ROADSIDE STOP ON THE GLEN HELEN ROAD WITH ITS UPHILL SPRINTS AND HILL TOP KING OF THE MOUNTAINS FINISHES MUST HAVE SEEMED AN UNDESERVED PUNISHMENT TO SOME RIDERS.

FATE TOOK A HAND BEFORE THE RACE HAD LEFT THE SIMPSON'S GAP NATIONAL PARK ^{WHEN THE} ~~AND~~ ONLY WOMEN RIDER IN THE FULL TOUR, VICKY LAWSON FELL AND HAD TO RECEIVE STITCHES TO A HAND WOUND. DARWIN RIDER GENE DIXON WAS UNLUCKY HERE AS WELL WHEN HE PUNCTURED AND HAD TO CHASE THE MAIN BUNCH WHICH WAS AVERAGING 35 TO 40 Km PER HOUR.

IN THIS STAGE THE BATTLE FOR TIME BONUSES AND POINTS DEVELOPED AS RIDERS SUCH AS SHANNE BANNAN, RICK SMITH, ALBERT STEFFAN AND GARY PHILLIPS TRIED TO WIN BACK SOME OF THE LEAD SET BY WATTERS WHO WAS JUST AS DETERMINED TO HANG ON TO HIS YELLOW JERSEY.

AT THE STAGE FINISH, ON TOP OF A 5 Km UNDULATING CLIMB JOHN WATTERS ARRIVED 7 SEC AHEAD OF ALBERT STEFFAN AND JOHN WHITLEY FOLLOWED BY SHANE BANNAN 16 SEC DOWN AND RICK SMITH 17 SEC. THE FIELD HAD BEEN SPLIT BY THE CLIMBS AND 1 TO 3 MINUTE GAPS WERE COMMON. DARRYL FLORANCE OF ALICE SPRINGS WAS FORCED TO RETIRE FROM THIS STAGE.

IN THE OVERALL PICTURE WATTERS MAINTAINED HIS LEAD, BANNAN NOW 1 min 27 sec DOWN THEN ALBERT STEFFAN 3RD AT 3 min RICK SMITH 4TH AT 4⁵ min AND JOHN WHITLEY 5TH AT 5 min

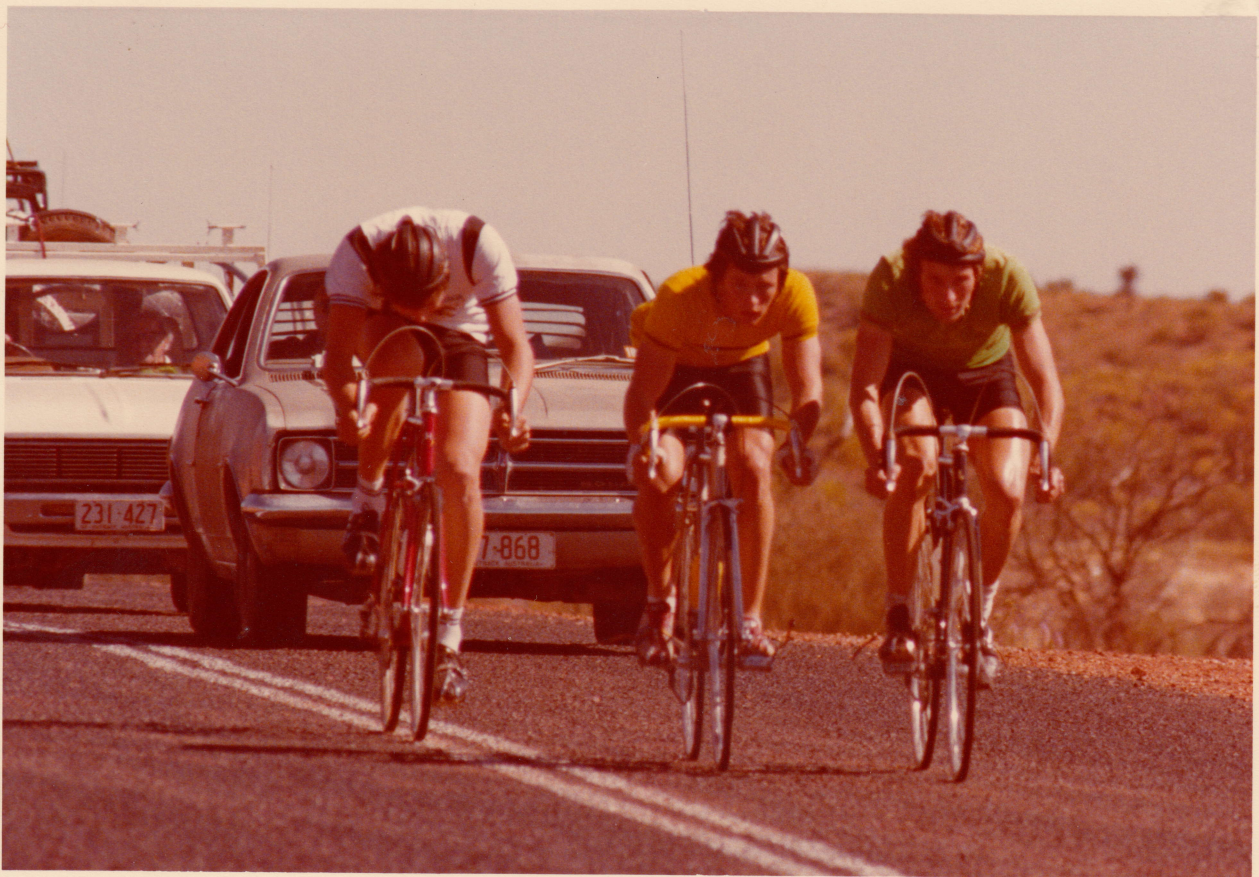
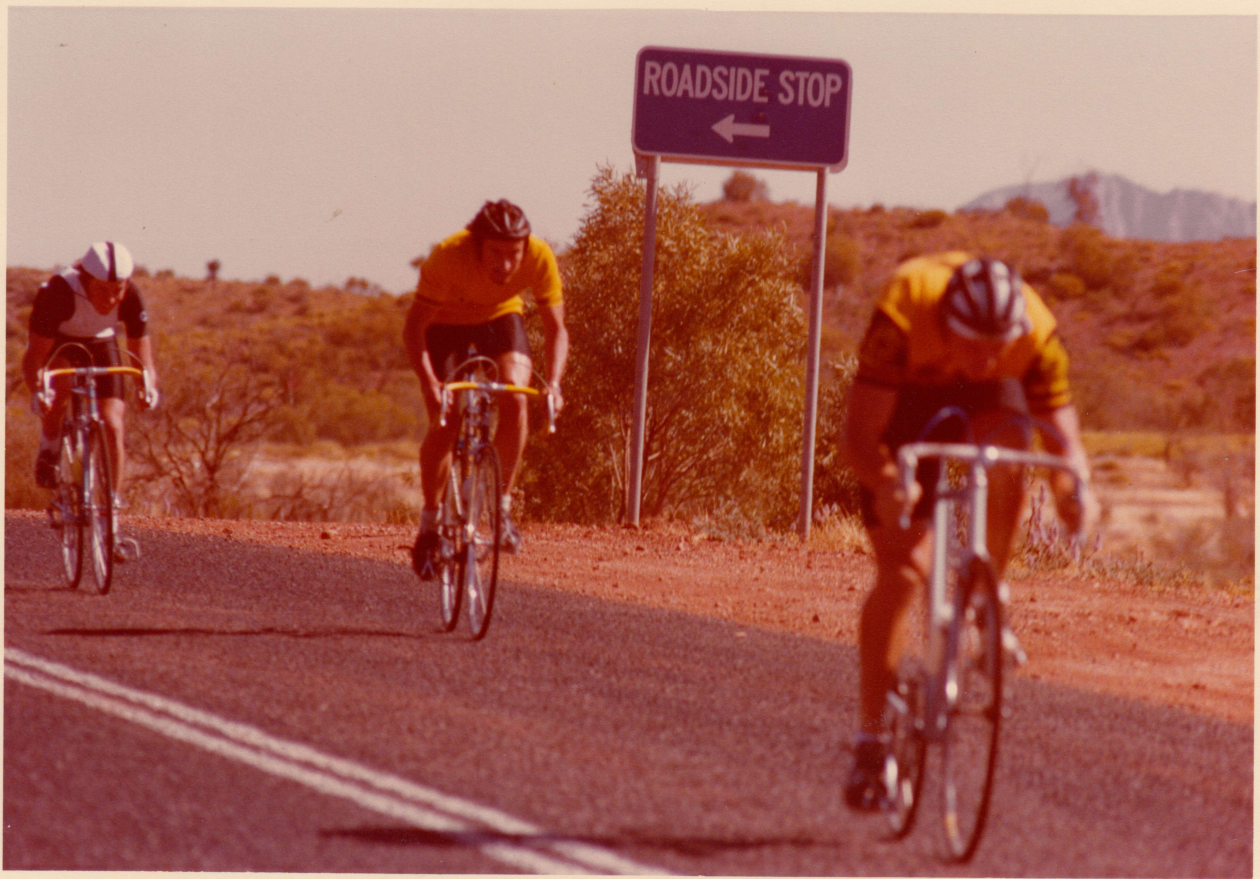

1982 GLEN HELEN TOUR — STAGE 3.

AT SHORT STAGE OF ONLY 25 KM FROM THE LOOKOUT TO GLEN HELEN LODGE SITUATED ON A PICTURESQUE BEND OF THE FINKE RIVER.

AFTER A WELL EARNED BREAK RIDERS AND OFFICIALS ASSEMBLED AND STARTED PUNCTUALLY AT 4 PM. THIS STRAIGHT FOWARD STAGE WITH ONLY THE FINISHING SPRINT YIELDING ^{TIME} BONUSES ALLOWED THE BUNCH TO STAY TOGETHER AND THE PACE GRADUALLY BUILD UNTIL THE FINISH LINE HOVE INTO VIEW.

AN EARLY LEAD BY DARWIN RIDER TONY BANNAN WAS SWEEPED UP AS THE BUNCH STAMPEDED FOR THE LINE BUT ONCE AGAIN IT WAS WATTERS IN YELLOW COMING OFF A WHEEL, SEEMINGLY FROM NOWHERE, WHO TOOK LINE HONOURS, FROM SHAYNE BANNAN, GARY PHILLIPS, TONY BANNAN, ALBERT STEFFAN AND GENE DIXON.

THE TIME WAS 36 MINUTES 32 SEC.

THE JUVENILE SECTION OF THIS STAGE BY GINO SABA IN THE VERY GOOD TIME OF 37 MIN 20 SEC.

SECOND WAS CARL WILKIN AND THIRD LIAM SHANAHAN ALL FROM ALICE SPRINGS.

TIGHT ^{CORNERS} ~~COUR~~ IN THE ORMISTON GORGE CAR PARK ENSURED THAT RIDERS DISPLAYED CONSIDERABLE BIKE HANDLING SKILL TO NEGOTIATE THEM WITHOUT LOSING MUCH TIME.



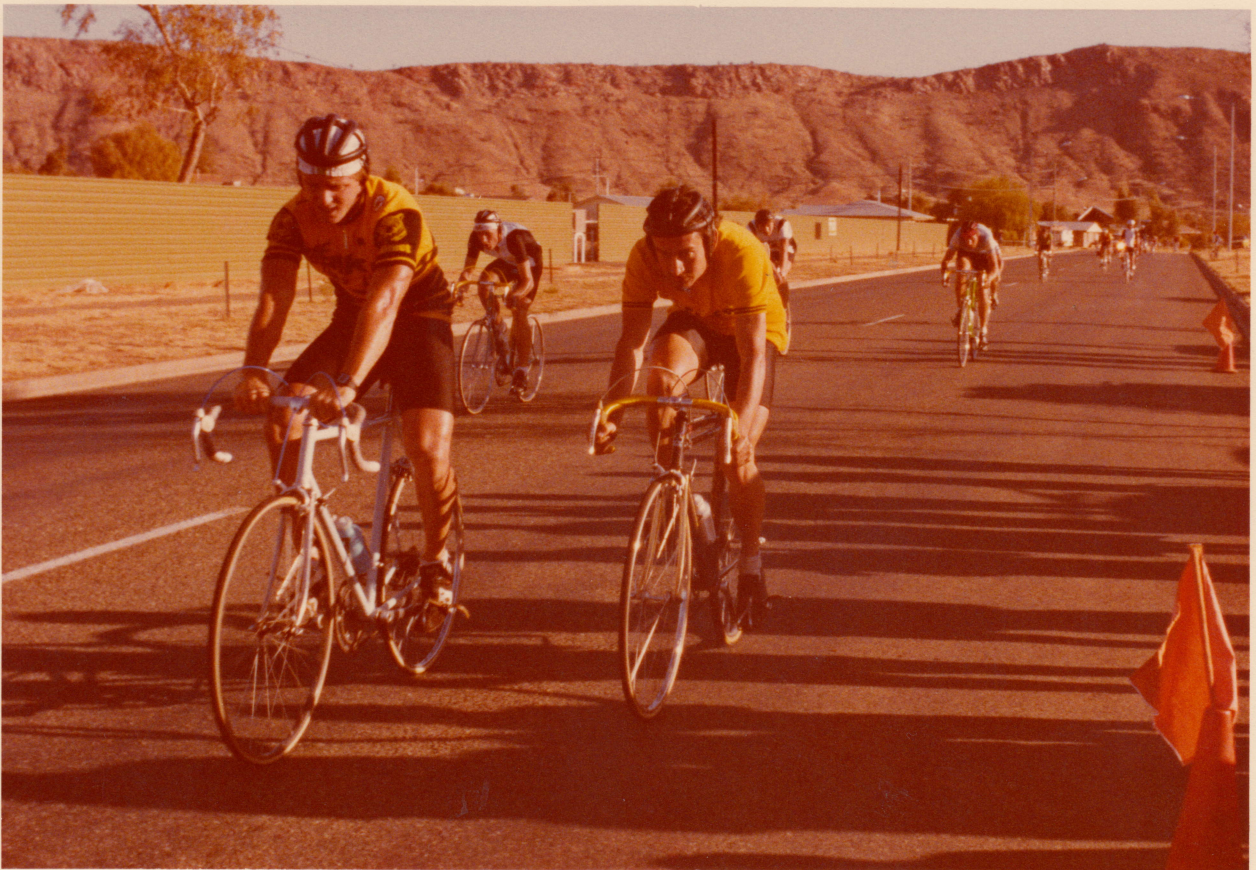

A COMPLEX STAGE WITH SPRINTS AND KOM'S EARNING
